

**ACC CHORISTER'S TOUR CONTRACT 2010
PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC, VIENNA AUSTRIA,
SALZBURG, AUSTRIA**

1. I understand that the quoted price of the tour is currently \$6,000 subject to final confirmation of numbers of singers traveling (which should bring the price down).

This price includes:

- Air transportation to Prague, Czech Republic,
- Land transportation by deluxe motor coach;
- Concert arrangements are provided as authorized by local and national authorities and are part of official celebrations. As such, the performance venue and schedules are subject to their discretion. Sightseeing and cultural activities are scheduled around these significant performances. (MCI is not responsible if inclement weather, local political situations, or changes made by the host concert site are cause for the last minute cancellation or change of a concert.)
- Accommodations in excellent 3 and 4-star hotels chosen for location, reputation, cleanliness and service.
- Meals include daily buffet or continental breakfasts and three-course dinners. Two dinners are on your own (but one lunch is included) while in Salzburg for the Mozart Festival;
- Guided excursions, guided by licensed, professional guides as outlined in the day-by-day itinerary.
- Entrances for all sights listed on itinerary;
- A full-time, multi-lingual Tour Manager will be with the group throughout the concert tour;
- Tips to hotel and restaurant personnel, tour manager and bus driver are included.
- Four adult chaperones; and
- A tour memory book.

2. The dates of the tour are June 24 to July 4, 2010.

- a. My family and I will pay for the price of tour based on a payment schedule as follows:

- i. \$500 **non-refundable** payment September 1, 2009
- ii. \$1500 payment due October 15, 2009
- iii. \$1000 payment due December 15, 2009
- iv. \$1500 payment due February 15, 2010
- v. Balance due April 15, 2010

- b. My family and I recognize the choir is entering into a contract for services with Music Celebrations International which includes cancellation penalties (independent of my \$500 non-refundable deposit) as follow:

- i. \$200 per personPenalty Begins: September 15, 2009
 - ii. 15% per person, of total tour costs Begins: December 15, 2009
 - iii. 25% per person of total tour costs Begins: February 15, 2010
 - iv. 50% per person of total tour costs Begins: April 15, 2010
 - v. 100% per person of total tour costs Begins: May 20, 2010
3. I understand I need to provide my own money for about 10 meals and any spending money.
 4. I understand and agree that my parents may travel in parallel with our group, but not as part of our tour group.
 5. I will conduct myself with dignity, diligence, skill, purpose and teamwork at ALL times, but most especially when on tour.
 6. When in public, I will conduct myself with courtesy and dignity.
 7. I will always show courtesy and attention to waiters, waitresses, hotel clerks, tour guides, couriers, hosts, and motor coach drivers.
 8. I will show respect and courtesy to all chaperones and staff on the tour.
 9. I will communicate clearly and honestly with my appointed chaperone at all times.
 10. When in performance and competition, I will concentrate on the immediate task, watch the director at all times, keep my composure, and **not talk on stage**.
 11. I will safeguard my health and well being at all times.
 12. I will get proper sleep and rest.
 13. I will make appropriate food choices and will make sure I consume adequate food and water for my energy output.
 14. I will communicate any special medical needs or concerns to the director and/or staff.
 15. I will provide my chaperone with my medications for him/her to disburse to me as prescribed while on tour.
 16. I will provide information necessary for any emergency medical treatment that may be needed such as insurance information, allergies to medicines, and so on.
 17. My parents and I have completed the general medical release required of all choristers and submit it herewith.
 18. I understand that while on tour, I may not use the telephone in my room except to call my chaperone.
 19. I will make calls freely on my cell phone during any free time; bus rides; or with my chaperone's knowledge and permission.
 20. My cell phone will be in the standby mode whenever in concert or rehearsal settings.
 21. **I may visit with friends in other rooms during free time, but only if my chaperones know where I am and have approved it.**
 22. **No friends of opposite genders may visit each other's rooms before ALL roommates are completely dressed and ready for the day.**

23. I will not roughhouse in the hotel room, throw anything out any window, or burn anything, matches or otherwise.
24. I understand that "lights out" means that lights are to be out at that time and no later. Any choir member who leaves his/her room, the group, or the hotel after lights out (or at anytime without permission), or breaks the law in any manner, will be sent home immediately at his/her family's expense.
25. I will keep my room tidy and picked up.
26. I will be courteous and helpful to my hosts.
27. I will launder, iron and pack my own clothing while on tour.
28. I will be responsible for my personal hygiene - teeth, hair and body.
29. I will abide by any and all policies and directions of the director and staff while on tour.
30. I will remember, at all times, that I am a representative of the Alaska Children's Choir, my family, my community, my state, and my country.
31. I understand and agree that my participation in the Touring Choir is contingent upon my adherence to the above listed points. I understand that my membership in the Touring Choir may be revoked at any time during the 2009-2010 season as a result of failure to adhere to any of the aforementioned items.
32. Further, I understand and agree that in case of sickness, disability, insubordination, infraction of rules or policies, or any other cause, which in the sole judgment of the director and staff requires such action, I may be removed from the tour at any time and place and returned to Anchorage at my expense. Further, I agree to reimburse the Alaska Children's Choir and/or any individual who may advance funds for my return to Alaska under the terms of this paragraph. I further agree that if it becomes necessary for anyone else to abandon the tour to accompany me home, my family shall pay to such person his/her additional expenses and extra costs for transportation.


